



Working for you

In recent years, your support has been hugely important; in the face of a unique challenge to our profession we have united together.

Our focus has been:

- Communicating effectively with members and the profession
- Campaigning for dentists suffering the financial pressures of this past year
- Bringing public dental health back onto the map after a long period of derailment
- Developing resources to ease the pressure of practice management
- Developing new courses and valued CPD training
- Providing additional resources and support for our student dentist members.

BDA in Northern Ireland

We successfully negotiated significantly improved pay and holiday entitlement for salaried services staff in Northern Ireland, including pay rises for staff of up to 12%, plus an extra day's holiday each year.

Restrictions on dental practices meant millions of missed dental treatments and increased pressures on dentists. We're pleased to have fought for a step in the right direction: a £1.5 million funding scheme in Northern Ireland.

Until June 2021, it was particularly unfair on dentists who had taken maternity leave during the reference period used to calculate payments. Following a campaign backed by us, the fight for fair payments was finally won for all dentists impacted by this issue. Thirty-eight dentists will now have seen their FSS payments adjusted and using non-abated figures to calculate maternity leave payments has been made blanket policy.


