September CPD Event: Management of older patients

Oral Health for the Vulnerable Older Person – are we prepared?



Mili Doshi

Mili is a Consultant in Special Care Dentistry at Surrey and Sussex Health Care NHS Trust and the Royal Hospital for

Neuro-disability. Mili developed the Health Education England national initiative 'Mouth Care Matters' to improve the oral health of adults in hospitals. Mili is the past president and current chair of the British Society of Gerodontology.

Aim:

This lecture aims to provide the audience with an improved understanding of the management of the oral health needs of the ageing population. Many older people will be increasingly vulnerable due to increasing cognitive, medical and physical disabilities that impact significantly on oral health and dental care needs.

Learning objectives:

- Increase understanding of the changing demographics of the older population
- Discuss the more common medical conditions and the impact of frailty on the older population and the impact on dental care
- Describe the importance of preventative dental care for older people and the role of the dental team
- Discuss treatment planning for the older vulnerable, considering medical, social and cognitive changes

Taking the pain out of general practice



Dermot Canavan

Dr Dermot Canavan is a lecturer and assistant professor at Dublin Dental School and Hospital. He is a former president of the Irish Pain Society and is currently

president of the Irish Society for Dental Sleep Medicine. Dr Canavan is also the director of a private orofacial pain clinic in Dublin.
